



## 2007 Kingsbury Browne Conservation Leadership Award

Award will be presented at Rally 2007: The National Land Conservation Conference on October 4<sup>th</sup> in Denver, Colorado.

The Kingsbury Browne Conservation Leadership Award is the Alliance's signature award, given annually to honor outstanding leadership, encourage innovation and share creativity throughout the land trust community. The Award celebrates individuals whose leadership has enriched the land movement and whose contributions embody the values Kingsbury Browne demonstrated in his own life and his work on behalf of the land trust movement.

### Criteria:

- The recipient has demonstrated extraordinary leadership in advancing land conservation through direct involvement with the land trust movement.
- The recipient embodies the values that characterized Kingsbury Browne and led to his own impact on the land trust movement, especially:
  - Innovation: Working to improve the practice of land protection through new approaches, creative initiative and uncommon vision
  - Collaboration: An active and effective collaborator with other land trusts, community groups and diverse interest groups, unusual alliances, etc. and explore partnering to leverage their potential.
  - Generous Spirit: Sharing ideas, experiences and knowledge with others to nurture and mentor the next generation of conservationists and leaders.
- In addition, nominees will also possess:
  - intellectual curiosity and integrity
  - a great respect for local initiative, bound together by common information, knowledge and standards
  - a conviction that sound legal practices and wise public policies are key to effective land conservation
- His or her impact reaches beyond a single community, land transaction, or organization to help the land trust movement reach new levels of maturity, competence and success
- The recipient may be at any stage in his or her career, so long as s/he demonstrates the qualities and impacts that are embodied in the Award criteria.
- Ideally, the recipient is able to accept the accompanying Lincoln Fellowship to undertake speaking, writing, teaching, research, mentoring or another uniquely designed effort to share her/his experience and wisdom with the broader land conservation community.
- In selecting recipients, the Alliance will look at the diversity of land trusts throughout the country, recognizing that many different kinds of organizations, with varied and evolving missions and methods, constitute the land trust movement.
